Challenge 1: We're Going on a Bear Hunt

Use the structure of Michael Rosen's "We're going on a Bear Hunt" to create your own version. You might be going on a Ghost hunt, a Zoo trip, a day trip or a simply to the market. Look at Michael Rosen's poem to help you devise your own. You might like to illustrate it with photos or illustrations. It can be a real trip or journey or an imaginary one. Have fun!

Challenge 4: Storytime
